## What is Rowing for BRC Like?

- Prepare in Winter Conditioning: combines erg training, running, and strength training

  - Regatta Saturdays:

    - Held at Sandy Run on the Occoquan River (FFX)

- School-Sanctioned, Self-Funded
  We're officially recognized by LCPS
  and Broad Run High School, but as a
  Tier 3 sport, we receive no financial
  support. All funding comes from
  participation fees and fundraising.
- Non-Profit, Mission-Focused
   Operates as a 509(a)(2) public charity
   — every dollar goes directly to
   supporting athletes, equipment, and
   regatta costs.

- Parent-Led, Team-Driven There's no paid administrative staff. Broad Run Crew is led by a volunteer parent board who organize, manage, and run the program — from logistics and fundraising to regatta support and team events.
- Every Family Plays a Role Whether it's driving carpools, volunteering at races, or joining a committee — your involvement keeps the team afloat.

### Every Dollar at Work: Investing in Our Team's Success

- → Equipment It's Expensive! Maintaining / Refurbishing / Purchasing
- → Travel: Bus to get our Team to / from Sandy Run
- → Regatta Fees: Entry costs so our athletes can compete
- → Food & Fuel: Nutritious meals and snacks to keep the team energized
- → Boathouse Practice Space: Protecting our valuable equipment and providing safe storage

# **Eligibility Requirements**

- Broad Run High School Students
- Farmwell Station Middle School 8<sup>th</sup> grade students may participate if they became 14 on or before Aug 1, 2025
- School & Practice Attendance
- Maintain minimum grade requirement

### **Financial Commitment**

- Winter Conditioning: \$150
- Spring 2026 Season: \$1,500 (broken into 2 payments)
  - \$1,100 due Feb 2, 2026
  - \$400\* due March 6, 2026
    - \*Athletes may offset this \$400 payment via fundraising
  - BRC Board will provide some "fundraising" opportunities that can aid in offsetting the \$400 payment, however, athletes are not limited to these options.
    - BRC Opportunities will include: RaiseRight and Erg-a-Thon Fundraiser
  - Athletes (and families) are encouraged to participate in any fundraising opportunities once registered
- **Uniforms:** \$90 new rowers only (or those that desire a new uniform)

- 5. Broad Run Crew Final Spring Payment (allowing you more time to offset it from fundraising)
