This is the AMP (Apprenticeship Multiplier Pathway): 60 hours of pre-requisite online coursework, 130 hours of in-person training over 14 days, and up to 120 hours of post-training coursework.

HOW LOCAL JATCs MAY RECOGNIZE GRADUATES

Many Texas apprenticeship programs are aligning with the Electrical College as part of a statewide workforce strategy. Where adopted within local standards, graduates may be:

- Considered for advanced academic standing
- Reviewed for direct or accelerated entry pathways
- Recognized for completion of first-year equivalent coursework

WHO SHOULD APPLY

- Individuals currently on a JATC eligibility list
- Candidates who meet apprenticeship entry requirements
- People willing to commit fully to 130 hours of in-person training (14 days)

Each local JATC maintains full authority over its own standards and placement decisions. This program is voluntary—it does not change ranking or guarantee placement. It strengthens readiness, and that matters.
