News

Community Links. A huge thank you to the pupils who were involved in designing cards for our charity wHoo Cares. These cards have been printed and we were expecting a batch, but due to COVID this has been delayed. I will ensure these are sent to the families of our pupils who designed the cards, but it is likely to be in the New Year now.

Curriculum.

Experiential Curriculum. The experiential curriculum this term has been Forest School. This term pupils learned about plants and trees, everyday habitats – the needs of plants and animals, environments and classification. Pupils also built dens working in teams. As you can see from the photograph, pupils have thoroughly enjoyed their experiences. Our older pupils have attended Challenger Troop. This is a military style programme which teaches our pupils skills in leadership, team building, improved communication and health. Due to the high number of pupils who have been absent because of COVID, this programme will continue into next term to ensure all pupils have an opportunity to fully engage. Many of our pupils will continue this programme over the next year and will be working on accredited programmes which supports their social and emotional development as well as promoting employability for when they leave school.

The experiential offer for our younger pupils **next term** will be **Living History**. Pupils will be studying Man through the Ages – Stone Age to the Ancient Greeks and also, the history of transport. These sessions will be linked to a series of interactive workshops held in school (in the absence of an external space). These workshops link to our History Curriculum.

Sex and Relationship Education. We are required to consult with parents on plans for this curriculum. Relationship Education should be taught in Primary and Sex and Relationship Education in Secondary. Our school policy was discussed with our Parent Advisory Group and you will see that their contributions have been noted and will be actioned. A further questionnaire will be sent to our wider parent/carers in due course.

Catch Up Clubs. Due to the ongoing issues with COVID, many of our pupils have missed so much school over the last few months. Our Catch-Up Clubs have started and some pupils have attended these sessions on a Monday after school. We will be promoting this further from January '21 and we hope that your child will participate.

Equality and Diversity Calendar. This term we have covered a wide range of topics:

- Road Safety Week and UK Parliament Week. In addition we covered:
- **Remembrance Day** Classes looked at the different poppies (red, brown, white and purple) and their meanings. Neptune class decorated the front of the school with coloured poppies and made a wreath using their hands as templates for the poppies.
- Anti-Bullying Week- A range of activities was provided for students to do in class, including wearing odd socks to show that it is okay to be different. The students were taught about safety and bullying online, covering topics such as liking negative comments, blocking and reporting.
- **Children in Need** The children enjoy the opportunity to wear their own clothes and paid £1 to wear something yellow or something spotty to school. Some classes watched Joe Wicks finish his PE marathon. The school raised £65.50
- On **Christmas Jumper day**, we talked about the Charity, Save The Children. The students and adults joined in with this wearing their Christmas jumpers and donated £1 to the charity. The school raised £71.51.

Website Updates. On our website, all parents/carers will be now be able to access curriculum overviews for the upcoming term so you are aware of what topics will be covered in each class with links to resources that could be useful at home. In addition, we have published remote learning timetables (where these are necessary) together with the resources your child will need to undertake their learning.
