Parental Reminders:

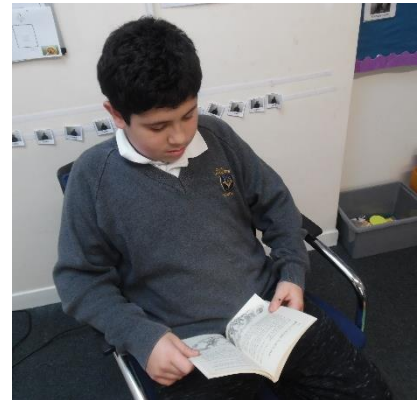
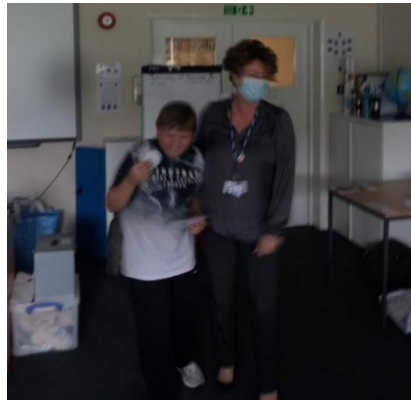
Attendance. A large number of our pupils have achieved 100% attendance this term. Well done to them and I thank those parents who have ensured their child attends school regularly. Unfortunately, this is not the case for all pupils. Pupil attendance should be a minimum of 97% and this means that they should not be absent from school for more than 6 days across a whole school year. We do appreciate that COVID has had an impact this term.

Vaccinations. Unfortunately, the COVID Vaccination Programme at school was postponed by the Local Immunisations Team and they have not yet given us another date. If your child is eligible and you want them to be vaccinated, we do recommend that you have this done locally.

All pupils are being sent home with a box of lateral flow testing kits at the end of term. Please do test regularly over the Christmas period and if you or your child starts to show symptoms (High fever, Sore throat, Lack of taste/smell) then please make a booking for a PCR test.

Curriculum Highlights:

We have had a number of pupils – Kian, Ollie and Theo who have all received awards for their reading accomplishments this term. Congratulations to these pupils. When Kian received his award, he took the opportunity to make a speech to the rest of his class and thanked his family and friends who made it all possible! It was a very moving and funny moment.

The experiential curriculum this term has been swimming. Those pupils who chose to engage have thoroughly enjoyed their lessons and for some pupils it is their first time learning to swim. Fantastic!

During Term 2 pupils from Neptune, Sun, Jupiter, Earth, Mercury and Pluto class have been enjoying weekly swimming lessons at Cascades Leisure Centre in Gravesend. Pupils have been taught by a qualified instructor, Vicky, who has helped to develop the children's confidence in the water.

Pupils have enjoyed learning new skills each week including water safety, practising different types of strokes, learning to swim with support and unaided, diving through objects underwater and confidently jumping into the pool independently.

For those pupils who were reluctant to get in the water, the opportunity was provided for them to sit and watch on the side to familiarise themselves with the routine and setting.

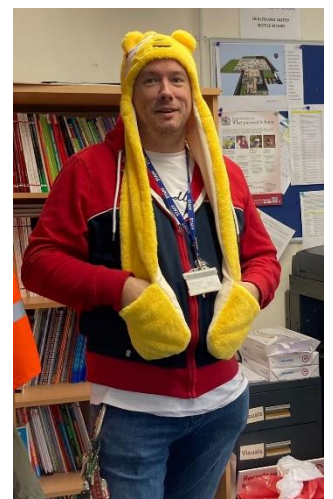


Bluewater Shopping Trip:
