


Curriculum News:

Experiential Curriculum Term 4

In the Primary School, we will be running Tiger Troop as part of our Experiential Curriculum offer which will be held in Sittingbourne. Holocaust Memorial Day

The 27th January marks Holocaust Memorial Day, the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau the largest Nazi death camp. The Holocaust threatened the fabric of civilisation and the threat and indeed reality of genocide is still with us today. Our world often feels fragile and vulnerable and we cannot be complacent.
