Curriculum News:

Experiential Curriculum Term 5

Tiger Troop and Challenger Troop have continued this term with high levels of engagement and achievement. This term, pupils have focused on the theme of **Integrity** and learning to:

- Communicate effectively with their peers and staff
- Demonstrate good listening skills and follow instructions
- Work as part of a team and respond to a number of challenges these being:
 - Participating in Sumo Wrestling competitions
 - o Fire Lighting and a Fire Flag Challenge
 - o Developing fitness and learning new exercises and responding to team challenges



Experiential Curriculum Term 6

Some pupils in the upper school will be attending Cyclo Park and will be learning to ride their bikes with confidence and work alongside peers to develop resilience and teamwork. Permission slips have been sent to those parents whose children will be attending. Please can you ensure that these are returned asap if you have not done so already. I look forward to sharing news from this programme and how successful we anticipate it to be.





Our Primary pupils will be attending Curley's Farm on a rriday wnere they will be consolidating some of their science topics this year, in particular what has been learnt about animals, with a focus on identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat. This learning will coincide with our maths for this term, measurement. The children will experience and apply their measurement skills to help feed the right amount of food to the animals at the farm.

Neptune will also be attending Anna outdoors. This is part of the Covid catch up. The children will identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. Neptune's art lessons will also take place during their Anna outdoors session with our brilliant art teacher, Holly. The children will work towards making nature sculptures inspired by Andrew Goldsworthy.



Construction

The school has converted a classroom space and set up a BTEC in Construction Skills. Pupils who have been enrolled on this programme have enjoyed taking part. The programme comprises: Carpentry, Painting and Decorating, Tiling, Plumbing & Electrics.

Equality and Diversity Calendar

This term we have marked a number of key events from our calendar including:

- National Earth Day
- Cultural and Diversity Day

For National Earth Day, pupils learned about global warming and how to be responsible citizens. The photographs below show pupils celebrating Cultural Diversity Day where each class decorated their rooms

representing countries from around the world. Pupils learned new words in different languages, went on virtual tours, listened to music, played games and tried different foods. The day was a huge success with pupils visiting different classrooms with their "passports". Countries "visited" were Japan, Egypt, Mexico, France and Australia.

Our Pupils

Pupils have taken part in a survey on school life. Some highlights from this are below:

- 91% of pupils said they enjoyed learning at school
- 91% of pupils said that teachers helped them do their best
- 95% of pupils feel listened to
- 100% of pupils said there is an adult they can talk to if something was worrying them
- 91% of pupils said behaviour was good in the school
- 7 pupils felt that the behaviour of others could be better
- Suggestions to improve:
 - Further work with pupils on being kind to others and accepting each other's' differences (as part
 of our school values)

The school continues to support a local charity, whoo Cares, and has already undertaken a number of activities on their behalf – these being a harvest festival collection and designing Christmas Cards. This term, a number of pupils on the Construction Programme have made planters which have been donated to this cause.
