


# City of Rochester School Newsletter

### 1. Experiential Curriculum Term 6

Some pupils have been learning how to ride a bike at Cyclopark and as a result have learned some very important life skills. Some children have attended Curly's Farm and have been learning about animal care, breeds of animals, where their food comes from and working safely on the farm. Anna Outdoors has also been in place for some pupils and during these sessions pupils have been completing Science and Art lessons. Pupils have been learning to identify different types of animals and their habitats, describing different animals, and also working alongside our Art teacher Holly to create natural art in the environment at the beautiful Ranscombe Farm Reserve.

We are setting up a partnership with Nacro College for pupils in the upper school to study an IMI Motor Vehicle Maintenance qualification. Pupils attended a trial day this week and it was very successful. This programme will start in September '21.




## 3. Equality and Diversity Calendar
