

### **Ofsted**

As you know Ofsted inspected the school in November 2018 and the formal report has just been published. We have a great deal to do to move Magic Arc Independent School forward and build further on its strengths. Our Post Inspection Action Plan is now being implemented and this regular half termly communication will provide you with highlights of the steps we have taken to improve our school and the education on offer for your child.

I set out on the right, a short commentary under each of the inspection headings. This is by no means a fully comprehensive overview of what is happening at the school, but is just an update on some key areas.

We are not sure when Ofsted will be returning but it is highly likely that this will be unannounced. I will of course keep you up to date on any news with regard to this.

#### **Leadership and Management:**

- The recruitment of a new Headteacher
- The introduction of new policies & procedures to ensure the quality of provision is monitored rigorously
- Establishing links with the local community

#### The Quality of Teaching and Learning:

- The introduction of weekly swimming for the forthcoming term
- An enrichment programme such as Forest School and school trips to enable pupils to bring the learning experience to life
- The recruitment of new teaching staff with specialisms in Science and Maths

### **Behaviour, Welfare and Safety:**

- The introduction of a school council, with pupils already actively participating in school life
- An integrated therapy service, including Occupational Therapy, Dyslexia support, Counselling and Speech and Language for students who require additional support
- A plan of capital spend on premises

#### **Outcomes for pupils:**

- A phased introduction of a new curriculum, with links to the National Curriculum, including science, ICT and humanities
- A new approach to assessment and the rigorous monitoring of pupil progress
