### 2019 Dog License Renewal Begins January 1st

*The Town of Danbury Requires all dogs four months and older be licensed before April 30th. Regardless of when the license is obtained, the license is valid from May 1st of each year to the following April 30th. The cost to license a dog is \$9.00 for a male or female, \$6.50 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$2.00 for a senior citizen over 65 years of age. If a puppy is too young to be altered the \$6.50 fee will apply for the first license. Please bring proof of rabies with you.*

If you'd like to participate by sharing, but are still looking for a favorite poem, there are many books of poetry on the library shelves in the children and adult sections from which to choose. We all love hearing poetry written by our own Donald Hall, Jane Kenyon and Carl Hultberg, and always enjoy smiling at the rhymes of Shel Silverstein and Jack Prelutsky, just to name a few. Adults and children, all are invited to this happy celebration.

And speaking of Carl Hultberg, he has again agreed to share readings of his own poetry at the library, Wednesday evening, April 10th at 7pm. The audience that enjoyed his readings, commentary and sense of humor last year, have been hoping for a repeat performance. Thank you, Carl!!

Spring is on the way and being outside in the warmer weather may inspire thoughts of wandering through a meadow or hiking along a mountain trail. Here is a suggestion for exploration and new family adventures in our new books section is a one entitled "Erratic Wandering - An Explorer's Hiking Guide to Astonishing Boulders in Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont". "A BaZillion years ago, as the Ice Age glaciers receded, their cargo of displaced rocks and boulders were often deposited in perplexing and fascinating ways." The authors' journeys have provided "hiking destinations to amazing balanced rocks, perched rocks, historic boulders, rock profiles, painted rocks and colossal boulders of such magnitude that humans are reduced to the size of a diminutive bystander." Directions, GPS, diagrams and maps are provided, as well as descriptions of terrain and other points of interest nearby. One such destination is Rock Rimmon – a.k.a. Rock Raymond in Manchester, which provides a great view over the city and Merrimack River with just a short 0.1 mile hike. Legend has it that "an Indian maiden named Raymond, disappointed in a love affair with an Indian brave, threw herself from the top this rock and perished".
