The Town of Danbury Requires all dogs four months and older be licensed before April 30th. Regardless of when the license is obtained, the license is valid from May 1st of each year to the following April 30th. The cost to license a dog is \$9.00 for a male or female, \$6.50 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$2.00 if you are a senior citizen over 65 years of age. If a puppy is too young to be altered the \$6.50 fee will apply for the first license. Please bring proof of rabies with you.

According to RSA 466:13 additional fines will be incurred after June 1st.

Library News June 2019

Warm, growing weather was late this spring, as observed by a library friend who unhappily had to be satisfied with store bought mint for Kentucky Derby Day juleps rather than his own fresh garden mint. Many of us may resort to purchasing seedlings from garden centers in anticipation of earlier harvests but there is still plenty of warm weather ahead for direct planting of seeds. The Seed Exchange Library has a good variety of choices, including uncommon bean, root vegetable and herb seeds from the Baker Creek Heirloom Seed Company. We also have a variety of gardening books for instruction and inspiration. Try this recipe for weed killer that will not harm birds, insects, pets or humans. Mix 1 gallon of vinegar with 1 ½ cups of Epsom salts and 2 tbsp of Dawn dish washing soap.

Do you know what a puddle garden is? It is a special type of garden, a rain garden that is designed to be both beautiful and a home for wildlife. With Jared and Laura Rosenbaum's book, THE PUDDLE GARDEN, children can learn how to make one, to provide a mini habitat for native plants and wildlife species. Borrow this book to share with your little gardener.

The second CliF storytelling presentation is scheduled for Wednesday, June 5th with New Hampshire author and teacher, Eric Pinder. He says that he "still wants to be an astronaut when he grows up but in the meantime you can often find him riding his bike or hanging out with bears in the woods. Bears appear in almost every book he's ever written, but his favorite animal is actually a giraffe, or maybe a stegosaurus." Eric will be at the school at 10am and at the library for preschoolers, and any homeschoolers who wish to join us, at 11:30am. Children will be able to choose a book to keep, to encourage them to continue reading during the summer months.

Hoping to further inspire children to read and write for pleasure during school vacation, we are again inviting them to participate in the library's Summer Reading Incentive Program. After reading a book and telling the librarian about a character in the story, the child may choose a gift from the Reading Rewards Basket.
