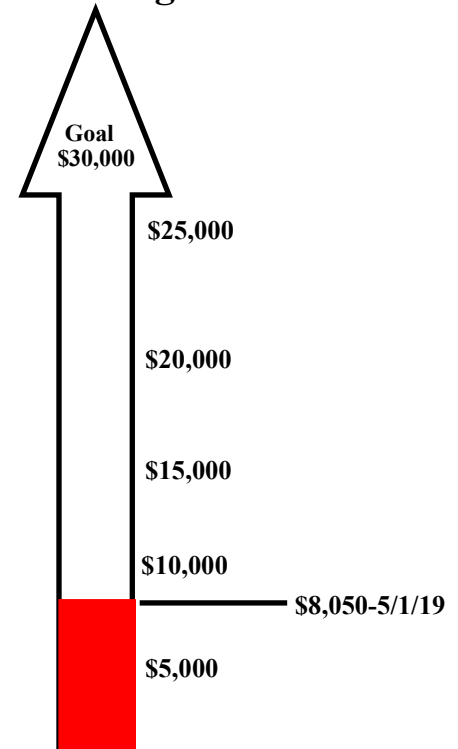

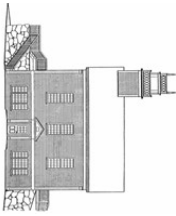

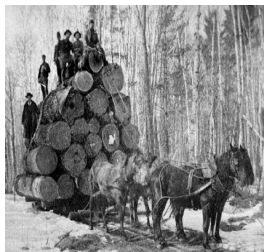

2019 Dog License Renewal Begins January 1st

The Town of Danbury Requires all dogs four months and older be licensed before April 30th. Regardless of when the license is obtained, the license is valid from May 1st of each year to the following April 30th. The cost to license a dog is \$9.00 for a male or female, \$6.50 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$2.00 for a senior citizen over 65 years of age. If a puppy is too young to be altered the \$6.50 fee will apply for the first license. Please bring proof of rabies with you.

Library News May 2019

May is the month well known for such days as Kentucky Derby Day, Cinco de Mayo and Mother’s Day. It is also the month to say thank you to our teachers and school nurses on National Teacher’s Day and School Nurses Day, this year on the 7th and 8th days of May. Uncommon days to celebrate are Dance Like a Chicken Day on May 14th (even if you aren’t attending a wedding party!) and Frog Jumping Day on May 13th. Whether that’s a day to jump over a frog or jump like a frog, and why it’s on the 13th of the month, are not clear according to the Holiday Insights web site. However, “the roots of Frog Jumping Day go back to Mark Twain’s first short story. It was first published in 1865 as Jim Smiley and His Jumping Frog. Later, he published it as The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County. It is also known under a third title The Notorious Jumping Frog of Calaveras County.” Curious about this notorious frog? We invite you to borrow one of our Mark Twain books.



Children all seem to love interacting with frogs when opportunity arises and the library has some fun and interesting books, nonfiction and fiction, about frogs. Young readers can learn about the life cycle of these amphibians in It’s a Frog’s Life – My Story of Life in a Pond, Frog – See How They Grow, and A Wood Frog’s Life, whose spring song, along with that of the peepers, tells us that spring is truly here. For fun is Dev Petty’s series of picture books about Frog who doesn’t want to be a frog and then doesn’t want to be big! In the next books he doesn’t want to go to sleep and then he complains about having nothing to do! Your children would love to share these books with you.

Sadly, our friend Carl Hultberg was unable to join us at the library in early April, but fortunately we were visited by Ewa Chrusciel, a poet and teacher at Colby-Sawyer College. She is the author of 8 books, including 3 books of poetry in Polish and 3 in English. She is also a translator, having translated works of Jack London & Joseph Conrad from English to Polish. Those of us in attendance that evening were grateful that she came to spend some time with us and we thoroughly enjoyed her poetry readings and the life experiences she shared, from which so much of her poetry evolved. Her comment that “Poets remind us to be faithful to beauty”, even when it is not so easy to see, struck a chord with many of us who were moved by her interpretations of life around us. Her poetry is now included in our library’s poetry collection.
