



Library News - October 2019

October is National Book Month. The goal, of course, is to encourage reading, an activity with proven benefits. It provides mental stimulation and knowledge. It reduces stress and expands vocabulary and memory. It's a month focused on remembering great authors and books and recognizing contributions of new authors. FYI - the top 5 American authors are Mark Twain, Ernest Hemingway, Edgar Allen Poe, John Steinbeck and F. Scott Fitzgerald. You can find their works in our library.

Another important goal of National Book Month is to encourage families to enjoy books together. Reading aloud and talking about books supports family time and bonding. A fun book to read aloud with your children is Judy Sierra's WILD ABOUT BOOKS. It begins in "the summer of 2002, When the Springfield librarian, Molly McGrew, By mistake drove her bookmobile into the zoo." The animals were hesitant to see what she was offering at first but, "By reading aloud from the good Dr. Seuss, She quickly attracted a mink and a moose......In a flash, every beast in the zoo was stampeding, To learn all about this new something called reading. Forsaking their niches, their nests, and their nooks, They went wild, simply wild, about wonderful books." The story continues with each animal choosing a favorite kind of book. The giraffes wanted tall books and the geckos could read only stick-to-the-wall books. You will learn which animal chose books about Nancy Drew and "Began solving mysteries right there at the zoo".

Celebrate the month by reading a new book. Recommended is Kim Michele Richardson's THE BOOK WOMAN OF TROUBLESOME CREEK, inspired by the Kentucky Pack Horse Library Project, a WPA program that delivered books to remote regions in the Appalachian Mountains between 1930 and 1943. The story is about Cussy Mary Carter who, despite danger and prejudice, is determined to bring the joy of books to folks in the remote, isolated regions of Troublesome Creek. One critic writes that this is a "timeless and significant tale about poverty, intolerance, and how books can bring hope and light to even the darkest pocket of history".

Are books an important part of your life? It would be interesting to hear and share thoughts, via email or, better yet, come to the monthly Book Discussion group meetings, the last Wednesday of each month, 6:30pm at the library.
