



2023 AMA Utah State Off Road Motorcycle Championship Series Youth Supplemental Rules

The 2023 AMA Racing rulebook and these Supplemental rules will govern these events.

SERIES CLASSES:

1. The following are the youth classes in which Utah Motorcycle Championship points will be earned.

NOTE: The single letter shown below, within the parenthesis (), are the class indicators. ⁽²⁾

1. Big Wheel	(12-16)	9-112cc 2t / 75-150cc 4t (Max 19" Ft / 16" R)
2. Mini (J)	(12-15)	66-85cc 2t / 75-125cc 4t (Max 17" Ft / 16" R)
3. Mini Junior (Z)	(7-11)	66-85cc 2t / 75-125cc 4t (Max 17" Ft / 16" R)
4. Micro Mini SR (K)	(10-11)	59-66cc 2t / 50-90cc 4t (Max 14" Ft / 12" R)
5. Micro Mini JR (U)	(7-9)	59-66cc 2t / 50-90cc 4t (Max 14" Ft / 12" R)
6. Pee Wee (P)	(4-8)	0-51cc (Max 12" Ft / 10" R)
7. Girls (G)	(12-16)	79-112cc 2t / 75-150cc 4t (Max 19" Ft / 16" R)
8. Girls JR (F)	(7-11).	59-85cc 2t / 52-125cc 4t (Max 17" Ft / 16" R)
9. Trail Blazer	(10-14)	79-112cc 2t / 75-150cc 4t (Max 19' Ft / 16' R) *

**Trail Blazer Class for first time riders, no points*

2. It is the rider's responsibility to enter the proper class. Failure to do so will result in the loss of all points earned. Results protest for position will be accepted 30 minutes following posting on-site. Once results are posted online following finish of event, Classification appeals will be accepted up to 48 hours thereafter. All points will be final follow appeal period.
3. **Trail Blazer:** Riders receive no AMA Points or Trophies. Class will only need to need to complete 1 loop (National Hare and Hound) to be considered a finish. Class will start with the last starting Motorcycle Row. Riders can enter Trailblazer as often as they wish.
4. **Pee Wee JR.** (Pee Wee B) (5-8) 0-51cc. Class will be at club – promoters discretion and will be a non-points class for beginners. 100% Trophies



PROGRAM:

1. At each event, all Championship classes must be run as listed in the Supplemental Regulations including class displacement. At the promoter’s option, additional support classes may be run. If youth support classes, and/or beginners are offered, they must be run separate from the Championship program.
2. Riders must finish under their own physical power. Towing, outside assistance or getting to the finish line by any other means will result in disqualification.

AWARDS

1. Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 riders in each of the youth classes apart from Pee Wee Sr. where all eligible riders will receive an award.

CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS:

1. Championship points will be based on the following points schedule:

Example: At a series meet, a rider may finish first in the 85cc class and third overall. He would receive 30 points for his 85cc class win and 21 points toward the Championship. Class points and overall points shall be kept separately by the AMA.

CHAMPIONS:

1. To be eligible for series awards, a rider must compete in half of the total number of events. If event total is an odd number, the total will round up. The series Overall, Pro Championships will count the riders scores from all rounds. Each individual class championship will drop their 2 lowest scores if there are 9 or more events and 1 lowest score if there are 8 or less events. If rounds are canceled during the series the original number of throw always will be counted. Riders may not use a canceled round as a throwaway. Throwaways are based on the total amount of events raced.
2. All riders who earned a Class Championship for the series in the previous year will be allowed to display their earned number during all competitions provided they participate in the same class or finish top three in a class.
