



WORK POINTS

1. For riders to receive work points the work point form found on the website must be printed, filled out, signed by the event promoter, and turned in to the UMORA scorekeeper within **10 days** of the event conclusion. Work point forms will also be available at each event at the sign-up tent.
2. For riders to receive work points they must assist a club or promoter with an event. The number of hours and days will be determined by the club or promoter. Minimum hours are 10 hrs. or one full day. Riders are eligible for up to 125% of their average earned points in work points. The sponsoring club/promoter is responsible for determining the percentage of work points earned.
3. Work points are limited to 1 event per year.
4. Work points will replace a lesser event if the number of counted events has been reached.
5. If a rider competes in multiple classes, work points can only be applied to one class.
6. A rider can race and earn eligibility at the same event.
7. Club Members and Promoters are eligible for up to 150% of their average earned points in work points for a race where they are involved in the organization, set-up, and operation of a race. The sponsoring club/promoter is responsible for determining the percentage earned from 0-150% based on the hours of participation from the rider.
8. Work points are counted towards an earned number, class award, and overall award.
9. A rider cannot receive both sportsman's points and work points for the same event.
10. Rider must compete in four events before work points apply.
11. Riders and club members working a race, must have a valid AMA card to receive work points.
12. PRO /AA riders are not eligible for work points.
13. DNF Points – A rider may receive one (1) set of 5 DNF points. Rider must start the race and in the event of a DNF it is the rider's responsibility to notify the UMORA scorekeeper in order to receive DNF points.

SPORTSMAN POINTS

1. Any rider who stops to help an injured rider or assists in providing safety for the injured rider and must leave the event while helping may receive sportsman points for that event. The final determination of awarding sportsman points will be made by the UMORA Board of Directors.
2. Sportsman points will be equal to the rider's best finish for the year. Sportsman points will apply to earned numbers, class, and overall standings.
3. Sportsman points will be added to the total year-end points earned and counted.
4. A rider can be awarded only one set of sportsman points per season.
5. If a rider continues the event and finishes, the rider has the choice of receiving either event points or sportsman points for the event.
6. A rider cannot receive both work points and sportsman points for the same event.
7. PRO / AA riders are eligible for Sportsmanship points.

AWARDS ELIGIBILITY

1. To be eligible for year-end awards a rider must earn eligibility. Eligibility is earned in a per-rider basis. Eligibility is required for both the Adult and Youth racers. This may be accomplished by one of the following:
 - i. Work Points
 - ii. Sportsman Points
 - iii. Substitute worker assisting at race, at Promoter / Club discretion.
 - iv. \$500 financial contribution to a land use organization. The donation must be provided to UMORA who will then forward the funds to a motorcycle-related charity.
 - v. Other UMORA board of directors approved events.
2. At the discretion of the promoter / club, a rider may earn eligibility points for helping with an event and still ride the event if:
 - i. If the rider has not been on the course prior to the event.
 - ii. If the rider does not have inside knowledge that would provide any unfair competitive advantage.
3. In order to be eligible for year-end points and awards, the deadline for earning eligibility is the last race of the season. A rider must compete in at least four points paying events within the current year's schedule to be considered for a year-end trophy.
4. PRO/AA - Eligibility is not required for all PRO/AA classes.

For riders to receive eligibility, the eligibility/worker point form found on the website and available at each event must be filled out and signed by the event promoter or sponsoring club member and turned in to the UMORA Scorekeeper within 10 days of the event conclusion.
