She has also enjoyed her leadership role with Youth Alive Club and being a part of Little Rock Central High productions, as choreographer for "You're a Good Man Charlie Brown" and "Beauty and the Beast: The Musical". Avaleigh has also taken to the theatrical stage, performing the role of Lady Hamlet in Shakespeare's "Hamlet", Marry Warren in "The Crucible", and a lead role in an original one-act play. Avaleigh will travel to Italy this summer to study Physical Theatre with Accademia Dell'Arte. She will attend Pepperdine University in the fall as a Theatre Arts major.

As a company member with Arkansas Festival Ballet, **Olya Tryndyak** has performed principal roles of Clara, Dew Drop Fairy and Sugar Plum Fairy in "The Nutcracker Ballet", Belle in "Beauty and the Beast", Bonbon Baroness in "Hansel and Gretel". Olya spent two summers training with Roma Pryma Bohachevsky at the Summer Workshop in Upstate New York where she immersed herself in the art of traditional Ukrainian Folk Dance. This summer, Olya will attend the Accademia dell'Arte Summer Dance Program in Arezzo, Italy. Academically, Olya is a 3-time International Science and Engineering Finalist representing Arkansas, and an AP Capstone Scholar with Distinction. She is graduating Cum Laude from Little Rock Central High School and plans to attend Tulane University in the fall to study cell and molecular biology and dance, on the pre-med track.

Arkansas Festival Ballet, under the direction of Artistic Director Rebecca Miller Stalcup, is a pre professional ballet company made up of dancers training at Arkansas Academy of Dance. Company auditions are held annually for ages 9 +.

AFB contributes to the cultural community in central Arkansas through quality performances featuring local and guest artists. Through a partnership with Arkansas Academy of Dance, Arkansas Festival Ballet encourages formal classical ballet training to promote a love of dance, and prepare talents for extensive training programs at major companies and schools

Arkansas Festival Ballet's Performance Season includes full-length storybook ballet productions, *The Nutcracker Ballet*, a mixed bill performance, and collaborative projects with local arts organizations.

Arkansas Festival Ballet has performed the classic ballets, *The Sleeping Beauty, Cinderella* and *Coppelia*, in addition to storybook ballets *The Princess and the Frog, Beauty and the Beast, Peter Pan, Alice in Wonderland, Aladdin, The Adventures of Pinocchio, Snow White* and *Hansel & Gretel*. Additional works include grand scaled productions of *Carmina Burana, Peter Grimes, The Magic Flute, Dido & Aeneas, Dracula Unearthed* and *Romeo & Juliet*.

Arkansas Festival Ballet strives to strengthen arts education in the community through its collaborative partnerships with organizations in Central Arkansas.
