* The City Council of Omaha, TX repealed their ordinance outlawing abortion in exchange for a non-binding resolution on October 14th, 2019. They did so upon the advice of their City Attorney after the ACLU filed an open records request. The City of Omaha is the only city to have recanted of their ordinance outlawing abortion as no other city was intimidated by the ACLU's open records requests.

** Curtis, NE (pop. 905), and Dunning, NE (pop. 109) have passed the ordinance on a first reading and have a second or a third reading before their ordinances go into effect.
