Dearly beloved,

If you don't have a morning prayer ritual, I strongly encourage you to develop one. For me, at least, it has become a daily requirement to pray on my knees. I start by repeating the Lord's Prayer, saying at least 3 "Our Father's" before praising God and praying for all of you and the other people in my life, as well as those who are facing certain hardships. I then read four psalms – psalm 1, 8, 23 (3 times) and 27. These are all positive psalms that encourage me, first and foremost, not to worry and that God has everything in His control – something we all need to be reminded of in today's everchanging world.

But that's not all I do. Between praying for folks and reading the psalms, I read two daily devotionals. The first, Sarah Young's <u>Jesus Calling</u>, speaks to me as if Jesus were talking to me personally. Typically, these are "feel good" messages of encouragement. The other, Oswald Chambers' <u>My Utmost for His Highest</u>, is superb and very deep but a bit more challenging.

Below is Sarah Young's devotional from March 28th. For some reason, God has put it on me to share this with you.

"I AM a God who gives and gives and gives. When I died for you on the cross, I held back nothing. I poured My Life *like a drink offering*. Because giving is inherent in My nature, I search for people who are able to receive in full measure. To increase your intimacy with Me, the two traits you need the most are receptivity and attentiveness. Receptivity is opening up your innermost being to be filled with My abundant riches. **Attentiveness is directing your gaze to Me: searching for Me in all your moments. It is possible to stay your mind on Me, as the prophet Isaiah wrote.** Through such attentiveness you receive a glorious gift: My perfect Peace."

What really stood out for me was the idea that we can focus not on our issues, but on God Himself. While most of us spend much time worrying about a future that does not exist – as Michael Singer states in his outstanding book The Untethered Soul "If you're bothered by the future, you're creating a future that doesn't exist that bothers you" – we Christians can, at any point in time, choose to disengage from our troubled minds and focus on a God who loves us and promises us that all things are working for our good. That whatever trials we may be facing are merely challenges specifically chosen by God to propel us to greater victories and deeper Spiritual growth.

We are now collecting scrap metal to raise funds for the church. Please contact Dick (413.786.2430) or Dave (413.854.8416)


