MISSIONARY

We held a special collection on 11/9 &11/16 to collect funds for the Samaritans Purse, and the donation will be used for the people affected by the hurricane in Jamaica. Meantime the Blanket Fund has been set up in the Narthex and will continue for the month of November. In December we shall be setting up the Mitten Tree to collect hats, mittens, gloves & scarves to be divided between the Springfield Rescue Mission and the Building Bridges program. We shall also be making up 40 Xmas bags containing personal and hygiene items which will be taken to the Parish Cupboard to be donated to 30 men and 10 women. Lastly, there will be a special collection at the Xmas Eve service for the "Christmas Fund" which provides direct financial assistance to retired and active UCC ministers, church workers, and their families. Envelopes will be placed in the pews at this service.
