The Pastor's Musings

It's March already, and Easter is March 31st! It's quite early this year, so it may still be a bit chilly. I remember, as a child, dressing up for Easter in a spring dress and hat! How many of us women will be wearing hats on Easter this year? Probably not too many, as it seems to have gone out of style quite a while ago.

As Easter approaches, you may notice that I often mention the fact that we are walking with Jesus to the Cross. I feel it is important to do so, so we remember what is truly important about Jesus' Crucifixion and Resurrection. In fact, many churches have started referring to Easter as Resurrection Sunday, the most holy of our Christian holidays.

So, what will you be doing on Easter? Hopefully you will start the day by coming to church, as we celebrate together the Resurrection of Christ. After church is usually a different story. There are many Easter traditions with roots that can be traced back to non-Christian and pagan celebrations. Examples include Easter eggs, and related games such as egg rolling and egg decorating.

It is believed that eggs represented fertility and birth in certain pagan traditions. Egg decorating may have become part of the Easter celebration in a nod to the religious significance Jesus' Resurrection or re-birth. And of course there are Easter egg hunts!

In some households, the Easter Bunny delivers candy and chocolate on Easter Sunday morning. These candies often arrive in an Easter basket. The origin of the Easter Bunny is unknown, although some believe it arrived in America with German immigrants in the 1700s. Rabbits are known to be enthusiastic procreators, so the arrival of baby bunnies in springtime became associated with birth and renewal.

Easter foods are also full of symbolism. An Easter dinner of lamb has historical roots, since a lamb was often used as a sacrificial animal in Jewish traditions, and lamb is frequently served during Passover. The phrase "lamb of God" is sometimes used to refer to Jesus and the sacrificial nature of his death.

So however you and your family celebrate our holiest of holy holidays, I wish you all a pleasant and meaningful Easter Day. And remember to thank God always for the Resurrection of our Savior!

Deacon of the Month of February: Sharon Christian

Welcome to March. Will she come in like a lamb and go out like a lion or come in like a lion and go out like a lamb? I guess on Mother Nature truly knows the answer. March brings many things – the first signs of spring and daylight savings time. Don't forget to spring your clocks ahead by one hour on March 10th. Here are some of the other things to look forward to this month.

It started on February 14th and continues through March 28th. Lent, which last for 39 days, one month plus 10 days depending on the years calendar. We as Christians do this because Jesus Christ suffered in the desert for 40 days. Ask yourself what you will give up for those days – coffee, chocolate, wine, salad, etc....

March 17th is St. Patrick's Day, which was originally celebrated in Ireland with religious services and feasts to honor St. Patrick for brining Catholicism to Ireland. He was a patron saint and Apostle of Ireland. One myth about St. Patrick is that he drove all the snakes out of Ireland after they attacked him during a 40 day fast.

March 24th is Palm Sunday. They say that the feast commemorated Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It gets its name from the palm branches the crowds of people waved and used to greet and honor Jesus Christ as he entered the city. The people made a path of fronds and clothing as a sign of respect and praise for Jesus Christ.

March 28th is Maundy Thursday or Holy Thursday. This is the day during Holy week that commemorates and washing of feet and the Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles. Maundy comes from the Latin word Mandatum and reflects Jesus' word, "I give a new commandment". The day always comes between March 19th and April 22nd.

March 29 is Good Friday. It's two days before Easter and the day we commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. We as Christians honor Jesus by not eating meat on this day. This is part of Holy Week.

March 31st is Easter Sunday. A Christian festival and cultural holiday that commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday. Easter Sunday has become a public holiday in the US.

March brings us all new life and new prospective.


