

When the day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then there appeared to them divided tongues as of fire and one sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues and the Spirit gave them utterance. Acts 2: 1-4

We celebrate Pentecost Sunday fifty days after Jesus resurrected from the dead. This day commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles and followers of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem. This year Pentecost is celebrated on May 19th. It is also celebrated as the birth of the church and Christianity.

At Pentecost through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit people of every nation are brought together in Christ Jesus.

On the night before He died Jesus told his disciples that He would be going away for some time. He reassure them that He would not be abandoning them and told them He would not leave them comfortless. John 14:18

Jesus promised that He would send us a comforter or helper that He may abide with you forever. The Spirit of truth whom the world cannot receive because it neither sees Him or know Him, but you know Him for He dwells with you and will be in you. John 14:17

Jesus left believers with the precious gift of His Holy Spirit, a gift that abides in us always. He is the Spirit of Truth and source of Truth and communicates truth to us. Just as on Easter as we celebrated Christ's resurrection, let us now focus on the Feast Of Pentecost as Christ's gift of the Holy Spirit, who guides us in our daily lives so that we can testify of the real meaning of our Christianity through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
