And to whom do we have to thank for all of this?

Not me.

For in the final analysis, I could work 20 hours a day, seven days a week and pass out a thousand of those invitation business cards I gave out to you the other day, and still not a soul might join the church because of it.

The answer is "Yes."

For God uses us to help fulfill His wishes.

I'm reminded of the story of the Rabbi who wants to win the lottery. He prays to God "Lord, let me win the lottery."

He doesn't win.

So he pleads with God. "God, I've been a good Rabbi. I've kept your commandments and led your people in the ways of the Torah. Lord, please let me win the lottery."

Again, he doesn't win.

Finally, he begs God to help him win the lottery. "God, I don't understand why you've failed me so far! You know how much I need the money. My kids are going off to college and I can't afford the tuition. Lord I beg of you please, *please* let me win the lottery!"

Suddenly a voice comes booming down from heaven. "Moshe," God says. "Meet me halfway – buy a ticket!"

The point: That God will work with us, but we have to do our part as well.

So my friends, let me leave you with this: This month be on the lookout for those who need a loving church home - and for those who need Christ. Then talk to them about our church and a God who loves them so much He sent down His Son to die on a Cross for us to save us from the consequence of our sins.
