Sad to say, but this will be the final “From the Pastor’s Desk” article for me as I conclude my Interim time with you on November 30. We anticipate and wait hopefully for God through the guidance of the Holy Spirit to provide a new pastoral leader in the near future. I know it’s been a difficult and sometimes painful journey, but getting it right is important.

Speaking of ends, the arrival of November reminds us that we are approaching the end of another calendar year, and the conclusion of another church year. (The new Liturgical year begins with Advent in December). We begin the month on November 1st, with “All Saints Day”. Many Christians know All Saints day as the time in which we remember and celebrate, not just canonized Saints, but all those who have entered the Church Triumphant. We honor our beloved members who have died (some this past year) and value the faithful service of those that helped the church arrive as the vital place in which we celebrate our faith.

On November 5, we celebrate “Veterans Day Sunday”. This is the Sunday preceding Veterans Day, which is always on November 11. and we reflect on the words cited in the 1926 congressional resolution proclaiming: **“Commemorate this date with thanksgiving and prayer ... to perpetuate peace through goodwill and mutual understanding.”** These statements apply today more than ever. We join all Americans in “Honoring Those Who Served.” We will recognize those veterans present on that day and celebrate the nation they served with reciting together the “Pledge of Allegiance” to the American flag and the nation for which it stands. (Matt Blackak, our dear and faithful member who died this year made sure we did this as a church each year -God bless you Matt).

As we as individuals and as a church look back over the events of this year so far and consider our current situation, what is our attitude? Toward the end of the month there is a day set aside for giving thanks. While this is a national and not a religious holiday, it was originally based on God’s provisions for the nation. (See President Washinton’s proclamation elsewhere in this newsletter). Thanksgiving is a wonderful experience when observed properly and sincerely. We need to be careful that we do not misuse the concept of giving thanks as an opportunity for personal or national pride. There is sometimes the pride expressed in the prayer of the Pharisee in scripture; “Lord, I thank you that I am not like other men.” Thanksgiving of comparison is always misplaced for it tends to denigrate the position of another. Thankfulness for God’s provision ought to be from humility not pride. Remember that the emphasis is thanksgiving “to” not “for”. God is the object of our thanks and therefore it is a personal interaction between you and God. Even when thanking another person, the emphasis should be on thank YOU. The short form “thanks” just doesn’t personalize it. (That’s my opinion anyway).

Speaking of leaders, on November 26, we observe “Christ the King” Sunday. This is the last Sunday in the Church year. While democracy is the best form of government we have at the current time on earth, sometimes following the will of the people is not a good thing. The Kingdom of heaven is not a democracy. God does not take opinion polls, nor can he be recalled or voted out of office. This is a good thing. It is better to have a perfect God ruling than imperfect man subject to whims and fads. Remember Jesus redefined the nature of kingship. He “came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many”. (Mark 10: 45)

That being said, I want to thank God and you for the privilege of being your pastor *ad interim* these past few years. When it comes to your involvement in the church, I hope that you do it in thankfulness to God for who God is – who apart from any particular blessing is worthy of thanksgiving. But also for what God has done for you and the church. We express our thankfulness through what we give in time, talent, and resources. Meeting the needs of others is our moral responsibility if we have been blessed by God with abundance (which is anything over that which is sufficient for us). We are not to be driven from thankfulness to a guilt complex – giving because we feel obligated. God loves a cheerful giver, whether it is of material things or verbal gratitude. We cannot have a “happy church” with unhappy gifts. You know that I believe a church should be a place of joy. May your giving thanks be an opportunity to reflect on your relationship with God and renew your covenant with Him and His church.

A Thanksgiving Proclamation - October 3, 1789, by President George Washington

*Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor, and whereas **both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me "to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness. Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be.** That we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks, for His kind care and protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation, for the signal and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of His providence, which we experienced in the course and conclusion of the late war, for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed, for the peaceable and rational manner, in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted, for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed; and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and in general for all the great and various favors which He hath been pleased to confer upon us. And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions, to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually, to render our national government a blessing to all the people, by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed, to protect and guide all Sovereigns and Nations (especially such as have shown kindness unto us) and to bless them with good government, peace, and concord. To promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and Us, and generally to grant unto all Mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best.*

Given under my hand at the City of New York the third day of October in the year of our Lord 1789.
