SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

Once the consultant had given us his findings, we held a congregational meeting to determine how we moved forward with our request for a new Pastor. It was decided at this meeting, that we should advertise for a three-quarter time pastor. From this we were able to rewrite our Church profile over the summer and this has now been submitted to the SNEUCC for their approval and we have asked for it to be placed on their website as soon as possible. In between times, we held a zoom meeting with the NACCC which was an informational meeting which allowed us to learn and ask questions concerning their association, with a view of the possibility of joining and advertising the Pastor position on their website.


