From the Fastor's Desk

"As we come to the end" and "As we begin", are two thoughts that come to my mind with December. It is the last month of the calendar year (the end). I am aware of the darkness it encompasses. It is the "dark month," because it contains the shortest day and longest night of the year in the Northern hemisphere. It is not only the physical darkness that concerns me, but the darkness of our experiences – with the continued focus on COVID and its variants and the social unrest and divisions in our country and the nasty negative political atmosphere surrounding the elections in November, but continuing through this month - it looks very dark indeed.

Well, so much for the negative attitude and message. The good news is that while "we come to the end" of the calendar year, "we begin" the church liturgical year. Beginning the last Sunday in November, we continue in December with Advent, emphasizing the anticipation of the coming (advent) light into the world in the person of Jesus at Christmas. The Liturgical year is centered on Jesus - His life, death, resurrection and promised Holy Spirit to continue His mission through us his followers.

Christmas is the shining event in December. We can enjoy it for it brings HOPE. We will have two services on Christmas Eve this year: at 5 pm (a multi-generational Interactive Worship service with candles and carols) and at 10 pm (a traditional candles and carols service). We will be using electric candles, but the visual effect will be the same. It is the collective light of our individual candles, symbolizing our lives living in the light of Christ that will bring truth and definition to our dark world. Christmas is on Sunday this year and having had two services on Christmas Eve, we will have a brief interactive service Sunday beginning at 10 am.

Jesus is savior. It is the meaning of his name given by the angel to Joseph and Mary. "...You are to name him **Jesus**, for he shall <u>save</u> his people from their sins." (Matt 1:21, Luke 1:31). If ever we needed a savior in the world it is today (actually again, for the world has had many dark times).

If our nation and its leaders would only follow Jesus and his teachings, maybe we will come through this in good shape. I am afraid there is more hope than faith in that concept, but that may be just me. We need to think of the positive message of our faith; beginning with the Transforming Triad – FAITH, HOPE, LOVE, that we read several times in scripture. During Advent we add the concepts of PEACE and JOY. All of these are positive and uplifting if we live their reality. As we live through this current darkness, which will probably spill over into next year, may we do so in the light of Christ's presence in our lives.

This month, as always, hold onto Faith and Hope so that you may experience Peace and Joy and be able to express Love in all you do.
