## From the Pastor's Desk

It's hard to believe that this is my sixth January Newsletter article. I wrote two during my first time as your interim in 2014 and 2015. I thought that I would be writing two more this time, but things haven't turned out that way. So here is my sixth message to start a year as a church.

What is the church about? We are a Christian Church; therefore, our being has something, if not everything, to do with "Christ". We are Christians - followers of Jesus Christ. With that in mind, in January we will begin a Bible Study on the Life of Christ, to be certain we know whom we are following and what his life and ministry tell us about being the church. I know I've mentioned before the meaning of the name "Lord Jesus Christ" whom we follow and serve. You may not have been here in 2014 when I wrote about it or you may have forgotten it, so I will summarize here. We know his name is "Jesus". In the Christmas story that we just rehearsed, the angel Gabriel tells Mary that she will conceive and bear a son and she is to give him the name "Jesus". 'The angel that appeared to Joseph after he learned that Mary was with child, adds the meaning and therefore the reason for the baby's name. "You are to give him the name 'Jesus', because he will save his people from their sins." "Jesus" is his name. It means savior and that is what he is. We believe in Jesus and recognize or receive him as our savior. We'll get into that more during our Bible Study.

He is also "Christ". This is from the Greek word meaning "anointed". It is the equivalent of the Hebrew "messiah". To be Christ, therefore, is to be the "anointed one of God". In other words, God has chosen him for a special task. "Christ" is his office. He is anointed as king – chosen by God to serve that office. We are to acknowledge him as such. He is both savior and anointed one.

He is also referred to as "Lord". This is his title. It is possible to relate to Jesus as savior and not get to acknowledging him as Lord. This is the next step in our relationship with Jesus. As savior, we receive what he does for us. As Lord, we give what we can for him. Jesus said two interesting things about the concept of Lordship. In Luke 6:46, Jesus says "why do you call me Lord, Lord, and do not do what I tell you?" Calling Jesus Lord implies obedience - He is in charge! The second thing he says about Lordship is, "not everyone who says to me 'Lord, Lord' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my father in heaven." (Matthew 7:21)

The one we follow is the "Lord Jesus Christ." His name is "Jesus" (savior), his office is "Christ" (anointed one), his title is "Lord" (the one to be obeyed). It is not just the saying of the name that matters, but the commitments to him as savior and obedience to him as Lord. In order to obey, we need to know what he expects of us. The church is about more than programs and worship services, though both are important, it is about being church – followers of Christ. As you welcome a new Pastor in the year ahead, keep in mind that the Pastor is there "to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." (Ephesians 4: 12-13)

This is, of course, all theoretical until you apply it in reality is your involvement in the church. But God has promised to bless our efforts. We will not be perfect as a church until we see Jesus in glory and become exactly like him. But we are in process and that makes it exciting and hopeful.

I hope that you have experienced and are experiencing the Lord Jesus Christ, so that together we can be a Christian Church – followers of Jesus, doing what God wills (or wants) in our community and the world. I believe that the mission and ministry of the church depends upon both pastor and laypersons working together to become God's people living in a way pleasing to God and beneficial to society. And as I always say: "We should have fun on this adventure together!"
