In the professional realm, Nathaniel engages in program development and sustainment with an eye towards diversity, justice, and anti-oppressive practice while focusing on efficient and sensible operations. Key is an intimate knowledge of and experience with equity considerations in multifaceted issues including legislative, legal, and policy realms. Through purposeful and intentional outreach and engagement, Nathaniel works to create connections with LGBTQ and veteran-serving organizations and the community at large to gain entrée with partners.

Additionally, he was awarded a Master's degree in Sociology at Washington State University and recently finished his second Master's (Masters of Social Work) at Portland State University with a Certificate in Human Services Management. He also holds a degree in Munitions Systems Technology from the Community College of the Air Force.

In serving those who served, Nathaniel has first-hand knowledge as he is a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces. He has served over seventeen years in the U.S. Air Force in various components. Nathaniel is third-generation Air Force, was deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, and continues to serve in the Oregon (Portland) Air National Guard as a Munitions Systems Craftsman. Furthermore, in 2017 Nathaniel became the first actively-serving military member in Portland and Seattle to participate in the Portland and Seattle Pride parades in uniform with command approval and in 2018 he organized the Portland Pride parade's first ever Military and Veteran Contingent.
