EV Charging Update

After a great deal of research by Tim and Theo, we now have a plan to install chargers for electric vehicles on Fieldend. The initial plan includes a twin-charger next to garage 42 and a

single charger to be installed near the substation. An app ensures that these chargers can only be used by residents. As the demand for electric vehicles grows, we have the option of adding further chargers near the west garage block. The chargers should be less expensive than charging EVs from a home supply, and will be significantly cheaper than using the chargers at a petrol station. We're expecting the chargers to be up and running by the end of November. We'll send round full details in the next few weeks.
