REMEMBER THE FOUR Ts

If you haven't started already, then it's time to start getting your rams prepared for joining. It takes about 7 weeks for sperm to develop from initiation to ejaculation so preparation needs to start at least 8 weeks prior to joining.

To check your rams are healthy complete the Four T's:

- Teeth check for sound mouth and gums. Check for overbite/underbite as this is a highly heritable trait.
- Testes and tossle Feel that testes and epididymides are firm and no lumps. Check the penis for abnormalities or swelling
- Test get rams tested that have unexplained lumps/swelling in epididymides for ovine brucellosis
- Toes trim feet if toes appear to long and treat and monitor rams with signs of lameness.

MEATY MATTERS CLIMATE FORUM

Held in Perth last week, the Meaty Matters
Climate Change Forum delved into
methane/greenhouse gases and the key role
livestock play in climate change. With
presenters including UWA Prof. Phil Vercoe and
CSIRO Dr. Brad Riddoutt. A few key points taken
from the day:

- 2-12% of energy is lost in cattle via methane
- Decrease methane by changes to animal genetics (breeding) and diet (forage)
- Different plants consumed by livestock contain different amounts of methane.
- Continued research is being done on the impact of additives and amount needed to be consumed by animals to decrease methane.
- 75% of grazing land is unsuitable to crops, 86% of feed is unsuitable for human consumption and 1kg of plant based food has 4kg of by products which get fed to livestock.
- Enteric CH4 is a full cycle
