CONFINEMENT

It seems everyone is doing it these days and its easy to jump on the bandwagon. Before you do, ask WHY are you doing it? To allow pastures to establish, manage sheep condition score, or manage limited resources (feed, water, labor), increase efficiency? Keep in mind your aim, to keep whatever system you implement in check.

These videos show some simpler set ups being successfully used in the Great Southern, discussing how each set up works, rations and some steep learnings: Zadow House Addis

There is no perfect system, but some rules of thumb are:

- Space 2m2 -5m2 per head. Most common size is 50x50m for 500 sheep.
- Draft in by size/weight and draft off tail every fortnight
- Induct with Pulpy kidney vac.
- Hay/lupin/barley mix (need calcium salt mix available too)
- Feeding: 15cm/head (2-5cm self-feeder)
- Water 1cm/hd, and away from the feed
