## **NUMNUTS TRIAL**

CSIRO is currently running an Australiawide field trial of Numnuts, which injects local anaesthetic at the time of ring application for castration and tail docking. CSIRO pays \$1000 for farmers to be involved and there are two people on the ground in WA who can help on the day.

Participating farms would need to be able to allocate 60 male lambs for the trial to undergo castration and tail docking at marking (4-8 weeks of age) with the NUMNUTS or with a standard ring. The lambs have to be observed for two hours after the procedure (this is where the 2 helpers come in) and then they can be managed as usual.

### **LAMBING**


You know its been cold. Its been windy. Which is good, you should have had time to think about your ewes... Number 1: Do

they have calcium? Do they have enough feed?

800kgDM/ha for singles, which is usually when you no longer have bare ground showing between the grass and clover, and twinning ewes need 1200kgDM/ha.

Here's the reminder..... energy requirements of an average 60kg Merino ewe, at different lambing times:

### **LAMBING VET**

As you may have seen on WhatsApp, our "Medical kit for lambing"

- FloPak plus (calcium/glucose)- for Hypocalcemia
- **Ketol** (Propylene Glycol)- is a game changer for preg tox.

As the above issues present the same way, if you are treating a ewe, use both.

- -Meloxicam (long-acting antiinflammatory) might also help. (Vet: "Yes it's worth it")
- **-Oxytet** (antibiotic) on hand yea- round for feet, dermo, shearing cuts ect.
