Gibberellic Acid & N on Pastures

Nitrogen (N) is a growth multiplier, enhancing the productivity of existing pasture biomass by increasing leaf size. Its effect is maximized when there's already a decent pasture base.

Green feed is cheapest to produce, so do this NOW to increase your feed: about 20kgDM/ha pasture increase per 1kg N if applied right.

Gibberellic acid and nitrogen boost pasture growth when used together during active growth. GA suits cool, moist conditions and works best on grasses, while nitrogen needs warmth and moisture. Apply GA at 2.5–20 g/100 L and nitrogen at 20–60 kg/ha for best results. Further info **LINK**

- FloPak plus (calcium/glucose)- Hypocalcemia
- Ketol (Propylene Glycol) game changer for preg tox.


As the above issues present the same way, if you are treating a ewe, use both.

- Meloxicam (long-acting anti-inflammatory) can also help. Some AgPro'ers use Buccalgesic instead, as have it on hand.
- Oxytet (antibiotic) on hand year-round for feet, dermo, shearing cuts ect. Also the best for mastitis.
