### **VITAMIN E**

Here's another reminder—it's time to give your lambs some vitamin E! It's been well over six weeks since they've had green feed. Vitamin E deficiency can cause sudden deaths, weakness, animals going down, or reluctance to stand despite remaining alert.

Administer vitamin E by drenching in the yards or mixing it into their feed (and act quickly!).

Dosage: 2.5g per head of vitamin E powder, or mix 5kg of product with 10L of water for 1,000 sheep.

Here's a quick comparison of average energy values (MJ/kg DM):

Feed	Energy (MJ/kg DM)
Hay - Oaten	8.8 - 10.2
Hay - Pasture	8.0 - 11.3
Silage	8.5 - 11.0
Oats	9.5 - 11.5
Barley	11.5 - 12.2
Lupins	13.0 - 14.0

## **RAMS**

#### **Get Your Rams Ready for Joining!**

Your rams are gearing up for the season ahead, and now's the time to prep them. Most of the sperm they'll use is produced in the **8 weeks before joining**, so flushing with **500g/hd/day of lupins** during this time can **double sperm production**.

Thinking of shorter joinings (4–5 weeks)? Most sperm is used in the **first 21 days**, with success dropping off sharply after that. To play it safe, add an **extra ram per mob** to ensure all ewes are covered.

Prep now for a productive season ahead!
