As normal we have full pens and plenty of calls asking for help. Since September last year we have funded over 170 neuters.

That's what the Herb Garden kittens have been. We took over the care of the four of them from

The Grove Vet when they were only 4 weeks old and still being syringe fed. They were handed in at the vet reception after being found in a garden.

We've had broken night's sleep, not getting any poos out, visits to the vets, making the most awful mess when weaning, getting too many wet poos out, food coming back up (more visits to the vets) and endless litter box cleans!

At 12 weeks Basil, Bailey, Thyme and Parsley were finally rehomed to four different families who fell in love with them instantly. And how couldn't they? They will be sadly missed but we hope they all enjoy their new homes and lives.





Back in early July we took in siblings, Beans and Toast from The Grove Vet. The poor little things had caught cat flu at a very young age and they were lucky to be alive. As a consequence of the flu, Bean had to have his left eye removed which didn't quite go as smoothly as we hoped as it got infected. However, he is now on the road to full recovery and he doesn't seem to let his impaired vision affect him. He is an adorably natured kitten and has won over many hearts.

Toast his sister had a bad eye at first too, but this managed to clear itself up nicely. Her sniffles are going on longer than Beans', but she is such a smaller kitten as well. Tiny nostrils!

She managed to fracture her leg as well so had to have a month of cage rest.

Beans is now pending adoption and Toast will be available for rehoming once her sniffles have totally cleared. We wish them long and healthy lives.



As always, we have many thank you's to make. Firstly, to **YOU**, our supporters. We've been donated so many items that we've been able to sell at table top sales and some items that are so nice we've been able to use them as prizes at events.

We get a constant trickle feed of funds coming into us from people that hold events on our behalf; bingos, table top sales, books sale and penny pots to name a few.

and 300 to 700 meters long. Both of which had no railings! All the sponsorship money came to us as everyone taking part covered all the costs of the event.

This event goes above and beyond what we hope for from our vets and we are very grateful for the support we get from both the Grove and Summerhill vets.
