We try to help cats and kittens that need special attention and a special person to give them a fresh start. Pearl is such a cat. She is feral and was in a dreadful state when found and thought unlikely to survive. She is about 8 years old, and has an incredibly passive nature. With the help of The Grove Veterinary Clinic, Fakenham and Doreen's devotion and tender care, she is getting there but she needs a secure environment and fenced-in garden area where she can be safe. Pearl has an irritable gut condition and is on a special diet with medication at the moment. Please don't let this put you off.

Well done and many thanks to everybody who has helped with the **Penny Pots** initiative. In the last year £507.18 has been collected. That's an awful lot of loose change.

**Brick Fund** savings are building up slowly and go towards our long-term goal to buy some land, a barn and more room to help our feral and homeless cats and kittens. £2,214 has been added in the last year.

Despite awful weather, the **plant stall** held at Home Farm, Hindringham (pictured below) on 4/5 June raised more funds whilst Doreen's plants continued to bring in donations outside her home and at other venues. In total £1,655 was raised in the last year.



A **tractor road-run** event held at Easter brought in £696 in donations. Collections at Morrisons and various stalls at Hempton Memorial Hall throughout the year raised £3,432.35. To add icing to the cake, we are delighted to report that we have received £4,646 from HM Revenue and Customs for our first claim against **Gift Aid** donations. **Foster Homes.** We occasionally have cats/kittens that need a temporary home rather than wait in a pen until they are adopted.

Requirements: a quiet spare room or space where a cat can get used to normal life in the home like the TV, phone and the dreaded vacuum cleaner. Foster homes also free up pens required for urgent new arrivals.

We also need **Volunteers** willing to go out trapping—a challenging but rewarding job. Traps are fairly heavy—it needs someone fit, patient and not afraid of the dark! We also need odd-job helpers from time to time.
