

#### The Sinking of the U.S. Army Transport Dorchester and the Four Chaplains

t was Feb. 3, 1943, and the U.S. Army Transport Dorchester was one of three ships in a convoy, moving across the Atlantic from Newfoundland to an American base in Greenland. A converted luxury liner, the Dorchester was crowded to capacity, carrying 902 servicemen, merchant seamen and civilian workers.

It was only 150 miles from its destination when shortly after midnight, an officer aboard the German submarine U2 spotted it. After identifying and targeting the ship, he gave orders to fire. The hit was decisive, striking the ship, far below the water line. The initial blast killed scores of men and seriously wounded many more. Others, stunned by the explosion were groping in the darkness.

Of course, it's a bit of a joke.


"If he sees his shadow, we'll have six more weeks of winter;





ongratulations to 2nd Lt. Madison Marsh, aka Miss Colorado — who was just crowned Miss America 2024! Marsh is currently pursuing her mas-

ter's degree in public policy at the Harvard Kennedy School through



the Air Force Institute of Technology's Civilian Institution Program, which falls under Air University. She is the first active duty service member to ever win the Miss America title.

The 22-year-old second lieutenant is the first active-duty Air Force officer to win the title

U.S. Air Force officer Madison Marsh is 2024's <u>Miss America</u>.

Marsh, 22, who is also a master's student at the Harvard Kennedy School's public policy program per CNN, was crowned as 2024 Miss America in Orlando on Sunday. She had previously represented Colorado.

"You can achieve anything. The sky is not the limit and the only person that's stopping you is you," Marsh said in an interview shared via <u>Miss America's Instagram story.</u>

She then added that if she could come from "a small town, not being part of the pageant," and step into the pageant world, then so could anybody else.

U.S. Air Force officer Madison Marsh is 2024's Miss America.

Marsh, a second lieutenant in the US Air Force, is the first active-duty Air Force officer to receive the title and succeeds Grace Stanke of Wisconsin, who was the 2023 Miss America. Stanke was also present on Sunday to crown Marsh.

The U.S Air Force Celebrated Marsh's win with a post on X — formerly known as Twitter — in which they called her "our very own."

Congratulations to our very own #Airman, 2nd Lt. Madison Marsh, aka Miss Colorado — who was just crowned @MissAmerica 2024! Marsh is the first active duty servicemember to ever win the title.

There were 51 contestants in total, who represented U.S. states and the District of Columbia. Preliminary judges chose 10 contestants to enter the pag-



eant, while the public voted for one, resulting in 11 semi-finalists.

Before narrowing them down to five finalists, the semi-finalists took part in four rounds of competitions, which included a fitness runway walk, a "hot topics" discussion, a talent show and an evening gown presentation.

The finalists then had to speak about their dreams and goals as Miss America.

Per CNN, Marsh opened up about her later mother's journey with pancreatic cancer when she spoke about the discussion topic of drugs in America. In the talent show round, she opted for a spoken word about receiving a pilot's license at 16.



Ahead of the pageant, Marsh opened up about what motivated her to take part. Speaking to SWNS, per <u>The New York Post</u>, she said, "It's an awesome experience to bring both sides of the favorite parts of my life together and hopefully make a difference for others to be able to realize that you don't have to limit yourself."

She continued: "In the military, it's an open space to really lead in the way that you want to lead — in and out of uniform. I felt like pageants, and specifically winning Miss Colorado, was a way to truly exemplify that and to set the tone to help make other people feel more comfortable finding what means most to them."



Panic and chaos quickly set in! Men were screaming, others crying or franticly trying to get lifeboats off the ship.



Through the pandemonium, four men spread out among the Soldiers, calming the frightened, tending the wounded and guiding the disoriented toward safety. They were four Army chaplains, Lt. George Fox, a Methodist; Lt. Alexander Goode, a Jewish Rabbi; Lt. John Washington, a Roman Catholic Priest; and Lt. Clark Poling, a Dutch Reformed minister.



Quickly and quietly the four chaplains worked to bring calm to the men. As soldiers began to find their way to the deck of the ship, many were still in their underwear, where they were confronted by the cold winds blowing down from the arctic.

Petty Officer John J. Mahoney, reeling from the cold, headed back towards his cabin. "Where are you going' "a voice of calm in the sea of distressed asked' "To get my gloves," Mahoney replied. "Here, take these," said Rabbi Goode as he handed a pair of gloves to the young officer. "I can't take those gloves," Mahoney replied. "Never mind," the Rabbi responded. "I have two pairs." It was only long after that Mahoney realized that the chaplain never intended to leave the ship.

Once topside, the chaplains opened a storage locker and began distributing life jackets. It was then that Engineer Grady Clark witnessed an astonishing sight.

When there were no more lifejackets in the storage room, the chaplains simultaneously removed theirs and gave them to four frightened young men.

When giving their life jackets, Rabbi Goode did not call out for a Jew; Father Washington did not call out for a Catholic; nor did Fox or Poling call out for a Protestant. They simply gave their life jackets to the next man in line. One survivor would later call it "It was the finest thing I have seen or hope to see this side of heaven."

As the ship went down, survivors in nearby rafts could see the four chaplains -- arms linked and braced against the slanting deck. Their voices could also be heard offering prayers and singing hymns.



Of the 902 men aboard the U.S.A.T. Dorchester, only 230 survived.

Before boarding the Dorchester back in January, Chaplain Poling had asked his father to pray for him,

"Not for my safe return, that would not be fair. Just pray that I shall do my duty, never be a coward, and have the strength, courage and understanding of men, Just pray that I shall be adequate."

Although the Distinguished Service Cross and Purple Heart were later awarded posthumously Congress wished to confer the Medal of Honor but was blocked by the stringent requirements which required heroism performed under fire. So a posthumous Special Medal for Heroism, The Four Chaplains' Medal, was authorized by Congress and awarded by the President on January 18, 1961.




This Medal was never given before and will never be given again.




