GCFM MEMBER SCHOLARSHIPS

All GCFM Garden Club members are eligible for [The Helen DeOrsay Freidberg Tribute Scholarship](#).

This scholarship, established in 2006, is awarded each year for EACH of the NGC schools held in Massachusetts: Landscape Design, Gardening, Flower Show School, and Environmental.

Scholarship to be given to one Garden Club Member per district to any of the GCFM Schools in MA per year.

Scholarship Application Requirements 1. An applicant must be a member of a GCFM Federated Club and may apply to any school in any given year. 2. An application form must be filled out by the applicant and signed by the president of her/his club. 3. An application must be received by the chairman of the Helen D. Freidberg Scholarship Committee BEFORE 15 Feb of the calendar year. 4. Only one member per club may apply for each course. 5. The course must be held in Massachusetts. 6. The applicant may not be a previous recipient of a scholarship for that school. 7. The scholarship is a onetime award. 8. The scholarship covers only tuition. Books, lodging, travel, and incidentals are not covered. 9. The scholarships will be awarded at the GCFM Annual meeting and must be used in the following fiscal year.

The form is being updated and will be available on January 15, 2026.

Deadline to apply is February 15, 2026.
