SB7. This bill relates to prohibiting a private employer from adopting or enforcing certain COVID-19 vaccine mandates, and authorizes an administrative penalty. Two amendments were added to strengthen the bill which should be duly noted: State Rep. Briscoe Cain's amendment protects students, volunteers, and unpaid interns. State Rep. Steve Toth's amendment will fine companies that do not comply with the bill with a \$50,000.00 fine versus \$10,000.00.



It reads "The legal sale of mixed beverages in restaurants by food and beverage certificate holders only." Bardwell will vote on Mayor and 2 City Council seats. Buena Vista-Bethel SUD will elect a member of the board of directors. Ellis county ESD No. 5 has a "Proposition A" that says "Authorizing an increase in the maximum ad valorem tax rate that Ellis County Emergency Services District No. 5 may impos on property within the District to a rate not to exceed six cents (\$.06) per one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation."




