

RESOLUTION RELATIVE TO PROPOSED ZONING
ORDINANCE FOR RICHMOND TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Richmond Township Planning Commission completed a survey of Township needs and problems in 1975 and thereafter, working with staff from the Crawford County Planning Commission spent one year working on and completing a Comprehensive Plan for Richmond Township, published in July 1976;

WHEREAS, the Richmond Township Planning Commission spent approximately 18 months working on a proposed set of zoning regulations for the Township in order to implement some of the recommendations set forth in the aforementioned Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Township Planning Commission held two public hearings on proposed zoning regulations and in addition held numerous Planning Commission meetings on said proposed regulations at which time citizens were present and gave comment, and throughout this process numerous changes in the proposed set of zoning regulations were made in response to the comments and observations of the citizens.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Richmond Township Planning Commission recommends, and transmits herewith, that a Proposed Zoning Ordinance for Richmond Township dated April 13, 1978 be considered for adoption by the Board of Supervisors of Richmond Township after a public hearing and appropriate public meetings are held as required by law, it being felt by the Planning Commission that the proposed set of zoning regulations is the best set of regulations the Commission could develop up to this point in time and that these regulations will protect property values and provide for responsible growth and work in the best interests of the vast majority of the people in Richmond Township.
