FROM YOUR ROAD CREW:

Hey there to all of you folks of Richmond Township:

It has been one of those back-and-forth winters and we do appreciate your patience. Dan and I are looking forward to the dry season. We have two grant projects this year and they will be for Eddies and Hickory Corners Roads. We also have projects that we will do using township funds such as cross pipe changes and also using the road reclaimer again this year. One of these in-house projects will include using an additive along with the grinding process on Humes Road. This will serve as a good test to see if this sort of practice will be used in the future.

For the past 2 years we have teamed up with both Randolph and Steuben Townships to complete projects as well as do regular road maintenance such as berming and ditching. Athens and Woodcock Townships have also been helpful with past projects and we look forward to working with everyone in the future.

We have a good start to replacing our road signs and we hope to complete that task this year. Our township boarder signs were put up 2 years ago and mark out where the actual borders of the township are. Although some might not think so, these borders have not changed. Maps dating back to 1942 show basically the same borders as recent maps. The borders are the same. This is how our liquid fuels money is determined. We have two more border signs to put up this year, after which the township will be completely marked out.

2012 AUDITORS REPORT

The Auditors held their annual reorganization meeting on January 8, 2013 and then audited the Township records on January 12th, 19th, 26th and February 2nd. The disposition meeting was held on February 12, 2013. All of the records were found to be in order and correctly recorded.

The Audit Report was e-filed with DCED in Harrisburg, PA, and copies were delivered to the Crawford County Courthouse and to the Richmond Township secretary.

For 2012, the revenues exceeded the expenditures by \$75,357.00. Revenues for 2012 increased \$60,372 over 2011. Expenditures for 2012 decreased from 2011 by \$15,197.
