These permits are required under the law in Pennsylvania. Any questions regarding sewage systems need to be addressed to our Richmond Township sewage officer, Mike Rinkevich, 814-833-1177.

Anyone needing a building permit must go through John Burnell, the building code officer, with Building Inspection Underwriters of Erie, 814-860-8044.

We are very fortunate in Richmond Township in that we are not hampered by all of the various "nuisance" ordinances that exist elsewhere in our county. We should feel good that our supervisors do all they can to balance complying with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania on one hand, and protecting our property rights with the other.
