This money was from the "Act 13 Environmental Initiative Grants" (unconventional gas well impact fees). FROM YOUR ROAD CREW

Hello everyone:

After a fairly mild winter, spring has arrived. The mild winter gave us some time to do some much needed work on the brine truck. A new, more efficient furnace was also installed at the Township Building. Now, like you, we're ready for warm, sunny days to bring the frost out of the roads so we can grade and repair the winter damage. Road repairs will be our main focus as the weather improves. Right now it would do more harm than good to start grading – the roads are soft where the frost is coming out and the grader is too heavy. We have purchased a transport disc which has enabled us to open up the frost blisters so they air out and dry up faster and also move material around to fill up some of the potholes. This should be a big help until we can start grading. Please be patient as we start with the worst areas first. We will get to your road as soon as we possibly can.

We have applied for and been awarded a grant from the Conservation Office for \$67,000 for a project on North Richmond Road. We will be replacing two large culverts at the bottom of the hill. Work will begin sometime this summer.

Just a reminder that the Township Clean Up Day will be Saturday, April 30th from 8 am until 3 pm. A crew of volunteers will unload your vehicle for you. Just remember that we will NOT be accepting tires, paint, household garbage, shingles and electronics (TVs, computers, monitors, phones). Appliances must have freon removed.

Please be safe and drive slowly. As always, you can call the Township Building at (814) 967-3822 to report any problems with the roads.

UPDATE**

Hello Neighbors and Friends,

The Richmond Township Planning Commission meets on the last Monday of the month at 6 pm at the township's office/garage building. The members are: Gary Coburn, Tom Morgan, Dan Myers, Mike Lokuta, Luigi DeFrancesco, and John Lawrence.

We have been working with the Supervisors and the Rec Board to develop a long range plan for improvements to the Rec Building and exploring some different grant opportunities to fund the improvements. The good news is that we have been awarded a grant for \$9,000 from the Crawford County Planning Commission, which will go towards sealing the walking trail, pouring cement pads at the picnic shelters and improved access to the shelters and the Rec Building. Additional improvements are also being considered. As things move forward, we will keep you informed via the Township website.

The County Conservation folks will be planting some trees at the township garage area in April with the help of some students from Titusville High School. We are also hopeful that we can secure some seedlings from the game commission to plant on the cleared area by the garage.

ANNUAL REPORT

WCJ Ranch, located in Richmond Township, is a non-profit organization that provides opportunities for combat disabled veterans and disabled hunters to enjoy the sport of hunting. This past fall, volunteers clocked 3,165 hours during 5 outreach projects helping disabled vets. WCJ Ranch had 162 visitors and hosted 70 hunts during this time. Summer plans are to continue the fishing program initiated last year with disabled vets and hospice wards at the Erie VA Hospital.
