#### WCJ RANCH ANNUAL REPORT

WCJ Ranch is a non-profit organization that works with combat-disabled veterans and children who want to hunt. We have nine wheelchair stands with top off stands for anyone able to climb. There is no charge to hunt. If interested, contact needs to be made by August for the upcoming season.

During the 2014 season, we had 92 visits with 11 hunters participating in 49 hunts. We also had 2 successful youth hunts. They harvested a total of one buck, four doe and one turkey.

Projects that we proudly completed in 2014 include:

- 1. Various trails and parking area reinforced with gravel.
- 2. Gravel added to 50 ft. wheelchair bridge approach.
- 3. Repaired Holt's Trail deer stand.
- 4. 75 foot ramp added to Gary's Camp.
- 5. New 20 x 24 storage building for tractors, wheel chairs, etc.
- 6. 2 beds added to main house for overnight accommodations.
- 7. Outreach to a Marine Corp Veteran from Cochranton, PA to assist with veteran's bills.
- 8. Planning, installation and maintenance for seven food plots.
