# Sharing our Stories. Sharing our Wisdom. A Joyful and Fruitful Collaboration with The University of Texas at Arlington By Barbara Berthold

This past spring under the leadership and guidance of Kirsten Holzmeier, four members of our Club embarked on a new adventure. Margit Lamb, Veronika Obrecht, Gerlinde Smith, and Elke Steinheimer met with a group of college students to tell them about their lives. The purpose was to create written records of past immigration experiences and thus, preserve personal histories for generations to come. Together, we achieved our goal. And much more. One of the students, an engineering major, summarized his experience as follows: "Being invited to meet a group of incredibly unique individuals and hear their life stories is something I'll never forget." Another student, an art major, asked about the applicability of her learnings, said: "I believe that my experience with performing an interview, no matter how limited it is currently, will also come in handy if I ever need to gather information about what a client or boss might need from me." For what else can a teacher hope? Especially when taking a leap of faith herself by adding a new element to one of her favorite courses.

The joint project with the GAC was conducted in my undergraduate course, "Texas German Experiences." The course provides students with an opportunity to explore and

reflect on Texas' German history, heritage, culture, and language. Texas has a rich history of German immigration and settlement. Besides a long history of German-speakers, German Texans left their mark on education, politics, the arts, and architecture. There is a plethora of materials available to explore and to better understand this part of Texas history and the immigrant experience more generally.

Most of the teaching and research, however, focuses on the German Belt and the 19th century. Adding our GAC project provided the students with access to another geographical area and time. They were able to learn why Germans came to DFW after WWII and how they made the Metroplex their home.

In addition, the students were able to see the era, with all its hardships and joys, through the eyes of those who have lived in and through it. A mix of lectures, discussions, and small inquiry-based projects made up the coursework. At the core, however, was our GAC project. The students learned about Oral History methods, researched the historical background, created interview questions, conducted, and recorded the interviews, transcribed the interviews with the help of Artificial Intelligence and produced narrative summaries.

Afterwards, they gave their summaries to the interviewees and incorporated the feedback received to ensure that the narrative summaries reflected the interviewees' perspectives. Four of the texts will soon be published in The German-Texan Heritage Society's Journal. This is an amazing accomplishment for the four undergraduate students that were selected. They have created a product that is not only read and graded by their teacher but is read and evaluated by a real-world audience. I wish you could have seen their smiles when they received the good news. All students benefited though, and they noticed it themselves as can be seen from their anonymous feedback surveys and their personal written reflections they needed to turn in at the end of the semester.

I am grateful for having had an opportunity to facilitate such an impactful learning-experience, which provided my students with plenty of opportunities for hands-on-learning and skills development. Leadership, research, teamwork, intercultural and intergenerational communication skills come to mind. I am grateful for the trust placed in the students and myself. My hope is that many more joint projects will follow. Together, we can make the German element in Texas better known and keep it alive.


