Roger L. Geiger, Distinguished Emeritus Professor of Higher Education at Penn State, was head of the Higher Education Program for ten years. He has written extensively on the history of American higher education, research universities, and higher education policy issues. His latest book, American Higher Education Since World War II: A History, was published by Princeton University Press in 2019. His preceding study, The History of American Higher Education: Learning and Culture from the Founding to World War II, (Princeton University Press, 2014) received the Outstanding Publication Award for 2015 from AERA Postsecondary Education. He received a Ph.D. in history from the University of Michigan (1972) and held various appointments at Yale University Institution for Social and Policy Studies (1974-1987) before joining Penn State.
