Donna Queeney graduated from Bethesda-Chevy Chase High School and earned BA, MS, and PhD degrees at Penn State. From 1974 until her retirement in 2002, she was a professor of Adult Education and held a variety of positions at Penn State, including Director of Planning Studies, and Director of Research and External Relations for University Outreach.

Donna authored over 40 professional articles, 15 book chapters, and a book, *Assessing Needs in Continuing Education*. She frequently spoke on continuing professional education, needs assessment and program evaluation, and consulted for several higher education institutions, professional associations, and other organizations.

Throughout the 1970s and 1980s Donna served on the State College Appearance and Design Review Board, and on both the State College and Centre Region Planning Commissions. In 1989 she was elected to the first of five, four-year terms on the State College Area School Board. Since 2012 she has been on the Zoning Hearing Board and currently serves as chair. She was president of the College Heights Association for eight years and coordinator of the Coalition of State College Neighborhood Associations.

Her other community activities have included membership on the boards of Discovery Space of Central Pennsylvania, Keystone Research Center, Centre County Mental Health/Mental Retardation, and Pennsylvania Centre Orchestra.
