### **Coral Bells**

Abundant coral pink hose-in-hose blooms with darker pink centers and veins make a wonderful spring show. Flowers are backed by tiny foliage on a low spreading form. Zone 6-9, 3ft tall x 4ft wide





**<u>Girard's Fuchsia</u>** In late April to early May deep fuchsia purple flowers open with lighter spotting in the throat. The large single blooms have a slightly wavy edge to the petal and cover the shrub in a brilliant haze. Dark green foliage takes on a reddish tone in the winter providing a stunning contrast for the spring flowers. Zone 6-9, 4-6ft tall & wide

### **Girard's Purple**

Vivid purple blooms with scarlet spots cover this compact, vigorous azalea in mid-spring; dark green glossy foliage emerges light green-yellow; needs highly acidic and organic soil that is well drained. Zone 5a 3ft x 3ft



### Hino crimson

The profusion of single, crimson blooms appear early and continue through spring. Loves the dappled sunlight of a woodland garden. Semi-evergreen. Zone 6-9, 2-4ft Tall x 4-5ft Wall

# AZALEAS, 2022



## **Rosebud**

This longtime favorite is true to its name, with blooms recalling the classic beauty of roses. Shell pink rosebuds open to rosy pink double flowers in spring. This selection is characterized by slow spreading growth and remains neat and tidy in the landscape. Evergreen. Zone 5-9, 2-4ft Tall & Wide



### **Stewartsonian**

Bursts with magnificent red blooms in early spring. The leaves will turn darker as the season progresses. Zone 5-8, 4-5ft Tall & Wide



### Hino White

Clean white, star-shaped flowers engulf the evergreen foliage of this fantastic dwarf. Will tolerate some sun in cool climates. Blooms early spring. Zone: 6, 1ft Tall x 2ft Wide



#### White Rosebud

Buds shaped like rose buds open into a profusion of 2" white blooms with chartreuse throats. Numerous ruffled, overlapping lobes complete the effect. 'White Rosebud' has interesting, **pale green new foliage**. Zone 5-9, 3ft Tall & Wide
