<u>Status of our Veterans Cemetery</u>: Thank you to Post Life Member Bill Cook, Chairman of the Orange County Veterans Memorial Park Foundation, for providing this progress update.

Background:

The idea for a resting place to serve Orange County's military families has been discussed since at least 2014. Five years of bitter fighting ensued in the Irvine City Council regarding a site for the cemetery at the former El Toro Marine Base. The site the City finally embraced required so much clean up and preparation that it exceeded the existing state funding and the rest of the money would not likely be budgeted for many years out.

Fast Forward to 2021:

The focus shifted to the **Gypsum Canyon** site, a gift of parkland from The Irvine Company, perfectly located near the junction of three counties, a magnificent site which will become a revered monument for the next century and beyond.



A powerful coalition of Veterans groups, community members, and elected officials united to advocate for Gypsum Canyon and <u>every city in Orange County</u> voted to support the site. The Orange County Board of Supervisors allocated \$20 million for development of the cemetery at Gypsum Canyon.

2022

The state or tribal legislature passed necessary legislation ... and appropriated funds for establishment and operation, officially paving the way for Gypsum Canyon to become the future home of the Southern California Veterans Cemetery.

2024:

Anaheim City Council approved necessary permits for development. The State budget included additional funding for the cemetery.

2025 Where are we now:

- On May 27, Irvine Mayor Larry Agran made another attempt to undermine the universally supported Gypsum Canyon Cemetery site in Anaheim Hills in favor of his Irvine site in the Great Park. His resolution failed spectacularly following public comments from 130 residents. This <u>finally puts an end to challenges</u> <u>by Mayor Agran.</u>
- We are waiting for the Title Transfer. The state or tribal government must have title to the land.
- Apply to the Department of Veterans Affairs for federal assistance with a grant. The Application has been prepared multiple times and we have appeared on the VA grant list for several years, first as Irvine, now as Anaheim, but always as a back-page 'non-conforming pre-application'. CalVet is in process of preparing to submit yet another application, this to eventually get us onto the Grant Funded list. The 2026 list will be published October 1.

This *should* be the final step before the essential title transfer. Once the County conveys title to the State, we will actually have a VETERANS CEMETERY. The OC Cemetery District and CalVet have been working details of shared costs, site and grading, infrastructure and operations. <u>We are anticipating dirt to fly in 2026</u>.
