Lifetime Service Award: At our January meeting, Gary Portas was honored for his many years of dedicated service to our Post. For more years than most of us remember, Gary has been the first welcoming face we see as he sits guarding the entrance to the Post.

Gary became a Charter Member of the Post when it was established in1987. As well as being an active participant in many of the Post activities, over the years he served as Chaplain, member of the Honor Guard, and currently has had a very long tenure as Guard.





Uncle Sam came calling when Gary was living in Chester, PA attending Penn Morton Colleges as a 20 year old Sophomore. On Sept 27, 1966 Gary entered the Army and underwent Basic Training at Fort Gordon, GA and AIT Training at Fort Jackson, SC before joining the 25th Infantry Division based in Cu Chi, Vietnam. Gary was assigned to The Centaurs, Heavy Scout Team, D Troop (Air). As a Door Gunner on a helicopter gun ship, Gary flew many missions picking up L.R.R.P troupes and also nurses before picking up the wounded. His Huey was shot down three times including once over Cambodia. Gary also had the honor of picking up Bob Hope for the USO Christmas Show December 1967. During his tour in Vietnam from March 67 to March 68, Gary received 9 Air Medals and a Purple Heart.

When Gary returned to the States in March 68, he became a Drill Sargent at Fort Dix, NJ
