US Flag Retirement Ceremony

Flag Day Ceremony: Flag Day is celebrated on the anniversary of the resolution by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1977 that approved the design of our national flag. This year will mark the **20th Anniversary** of the annual Flag Day ceremony by the City of Rancho Santa Margarita. This is an opportunity to honor the American Flag in partnership with City officials, VFW Post 6024, and local Scout units. The ceremony is held to properly destroy by burning, worn, damaged, or otherwise unserviceable American flags in a dignified manner.

Join us on Friday, June 14, at 19:30 on the lawn at the Bell Tower behind City Hall. Please bring lawn chairs for seating and any worn or damaged US Flags in need of disposal. After the scouts perform the ritual of cutting and burning the first flag, members of the audience are invited to join in the tribute of retiring a flag.

Memorial Day: Our Post Honor Guard will participate in two Memorial Day programs on May 27. The City of Mission Viejo ceremony will be at 8:30 am in The Kershaw Garden at the Civic Center. Guest speakers will include Colonel Matthew D. Lundgren, Commanding Officer of Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division; and Jeffrey Andrade, Veteran's Administration, US Marine Corp, Retired. In addition, Commander William Leber, American Legion Post 281 will light the eternal flame of remembrance in honor of the fallen and in recognition of Vietnam POW/MIAs. The audience will receive a candle at the end of the ceremony and are encouraged to place it around the eternal flame memorial in remembrance of a fallen hero. Also, the American Heroes Tribute Banners honoring service members who have lost their lives in combat will be displayed throughout the Civic Center walkway and Kershaw Gardens through June 1.

El Toro Memorial Park will hold it's annual Memorial Day Program at 11:00 am. This year's keynote speaker has not been announced. Music will be provided by the Master Chorale of Saddleback Valley, a wreath presentation will be done by representatives from surrounding cities and participating patriotic and veteran organizations, and our Honor Guard will fire the three-volley salute. A very interesting World War I Historical Display provided by American Legion Chaplain Frank Cook will be available for all to visit before and after the program.
