### How's it Possible...

Ice skates have been around for longer than you would think. An ancient pair of ice skates were found at the bottom of a lake in northern Europe. Scientists estimate that these skates have existed since 3000 B.C. The skates were made from the leg bones of large animals. Holes were drilled on each end of the bone and leather straps were used as laces. In the 14th century, the Dutch invented platform skates with iron runners on the bottom. The skates functioned similar to skiing. By the 17th century a double-edged blade replaced the iron runners on skates, and were used mostly for transportation.

# When Did That Happen...

On Christmas Eve, 1968, Apollo 8 (was the second crewed mission of the Apollo program and the first mission to bring humans to the moon) reached the moon's orbit. Apollo 8 was the first piloted spacecraft of any kind to break free from the Earth's orbit and then circle around another celestial body. In honor of the historic event, the astronauts aboard the ship sent out a special live Christmas Eve broadcast: images of Earth and the moon, along the readings from the book of Genesis.


